7,800 benefitting students
in grades 6–8
from **83** schools in Nepal.



4,694 girls

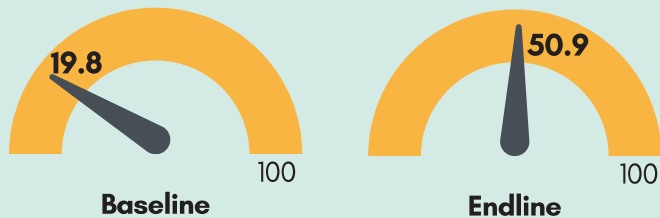


3,106 boys



Results

The **average marks score of students increased** from baseline to endline after attending remedial sessions.



Analysis by **gender** showed similar improved learning outcomes.

Program Components

Remedial Sessions

Run by trained teachers prior to academic hours and covered **4 subjects - English, Math, Nepali, and Science.**

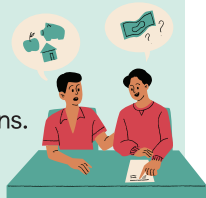


Provided Bursary support for all students including a bag, school dress, self-learning materials and stationery.



Counseling & Life Skills Sessions

540 psychosocial first aid counseling and **2,700 life skills** sessions benefitting 7,800 students attending remedial sessions.



The sessions aimed to enhance students' skills related to **communication** with peers and teachers, building personal **career goals**, and defining **life aspirations**.



Parenting Sessions

Completed sessions with **6,522** parents.

These sessions encouraged parents to allow **daughters to continue their education** and provided an **enabling environment** for continued learning through positive parenting sessions.
