d for a modern Family Planning method soon after delivery

The right method is the one that suits you



Oral Contraceptive Pills

- Effective short-acting method that is taken everyday
- Safe for women of any age, including women who have never had a baby
- The mini-pill is safe for breastfeeding mothers anytime after delivery.



Intra-Uterine Device (IUD)

- Effective long-acting method that lasts 5-10 years
- Safe for women of any age, including women who have never had a baby
- Can be used within 48 hours of childbirth or after 4 weeks after childbirth
- · Safe for breastfeeding mothers.



Lactational Amenorrhoea Method (Exclusive Breastfeeding)

- Effective post-partum method when women meet all three criteria
- Are breastfeeding exclusively (day and night)
- Have an infant younger than 6 months old
- · Do not have menstrual bleeding.



Injectable

- Effective short-acting method that lasts 2 or 3 months
- Safe for women of any age, including women who have never had a baby
- Safe for breastfeeding mothers with a baby more than 6 weeks old.



Male Condom

- Effective short-acting method that is used at the time of sex
- When used correctly at every time, it:
- Prevents the female partner from getting pregnant
- Prevents Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs), including HIV/AIDS.



Female Condom

- Effective short-acting method that is used at the time of sex
- When used correctly at every time, it:
- · Prevents pregnancy
- Prevents Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs), including HIV/AIDS
- · Safe for breastfeeding mothers.



Emergency Contraceptive Pills (ECPs)

- Used only for emergencies and not appropriate for regular use
- Can prevent pregnancy when taken up to 120 hours after unplanned sexual intercourse
- Should not be taken more than twice a month



Tubal Ligation

 Effective permanent method for women who do not wish to get pregnant again.



Vasectomy

 Effective permanent method for men who do not want their partners to get pregnant again.



Implant

- Effective long-acting method that lasts 3-5 years
- Safe for women of any age, including women who have never had a baby
- Safe for breastfeeding mothers anytime after delivery.
