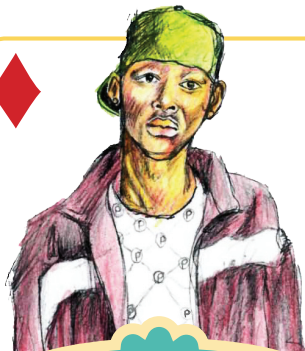

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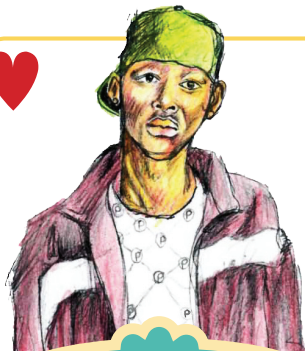

Condom Use

How to learn and practice putting on a condom correctly every time

Reason

Using condoms can be daunting and require preparation.

Risk

Without using a condom you cannot protect yourself and your loved ones from HIV, STIs or pregnancy.

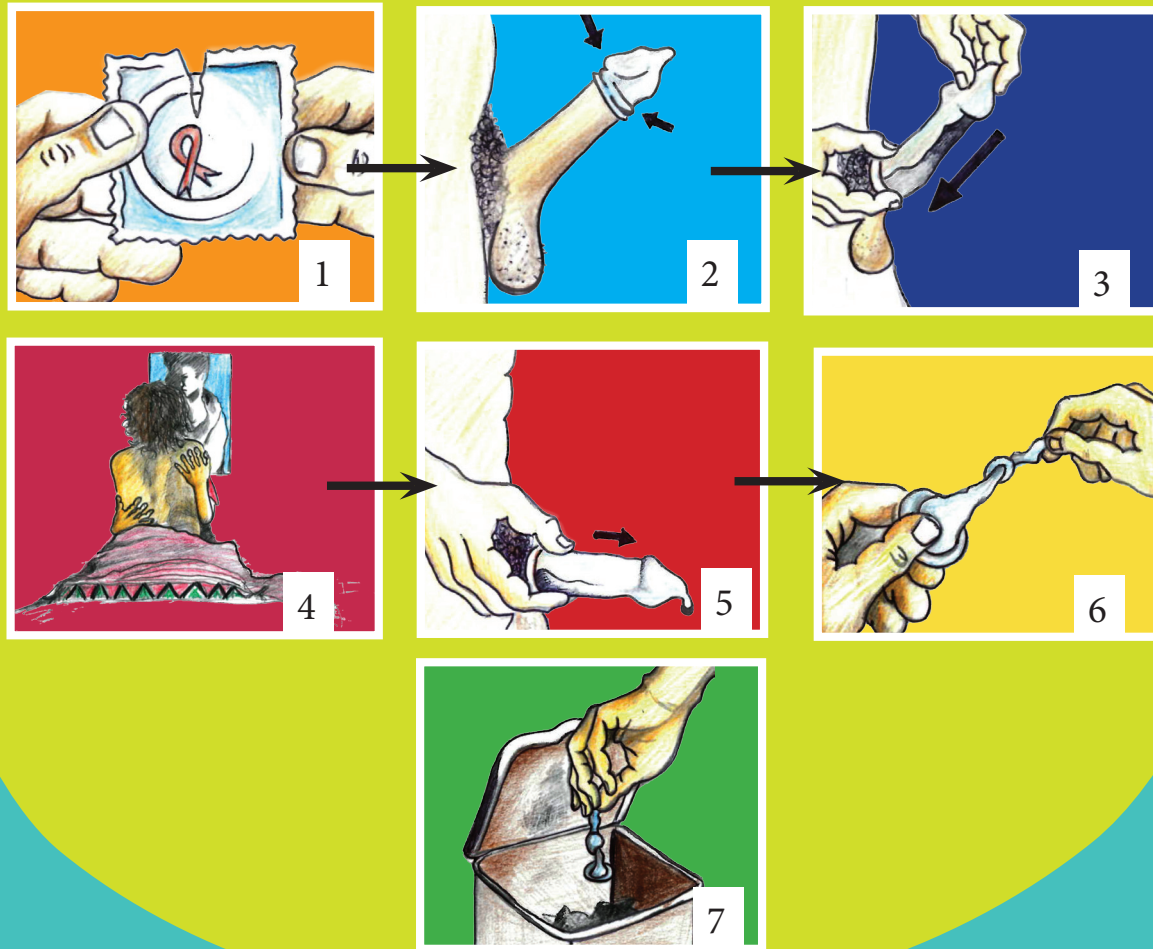
Right

You and your partner have the right to be protected from HIV, STIs and unwanted pregnancy; so talk and share safer sex.

Responsibility

You are responsible to protect yourself and others from harm. Practice and make sure the condom is on before you have sex.

Alcohol & Sex

Discuss how lots of alcohol can lead to unsafe sex

Reason

When you drink alcohol with your friends, you feel free and easy.

Risk

When you drink too much alcohol, you may do something that you would not otherwise do and put yourself at risk of HIV, STIs, pregnancy or violence.

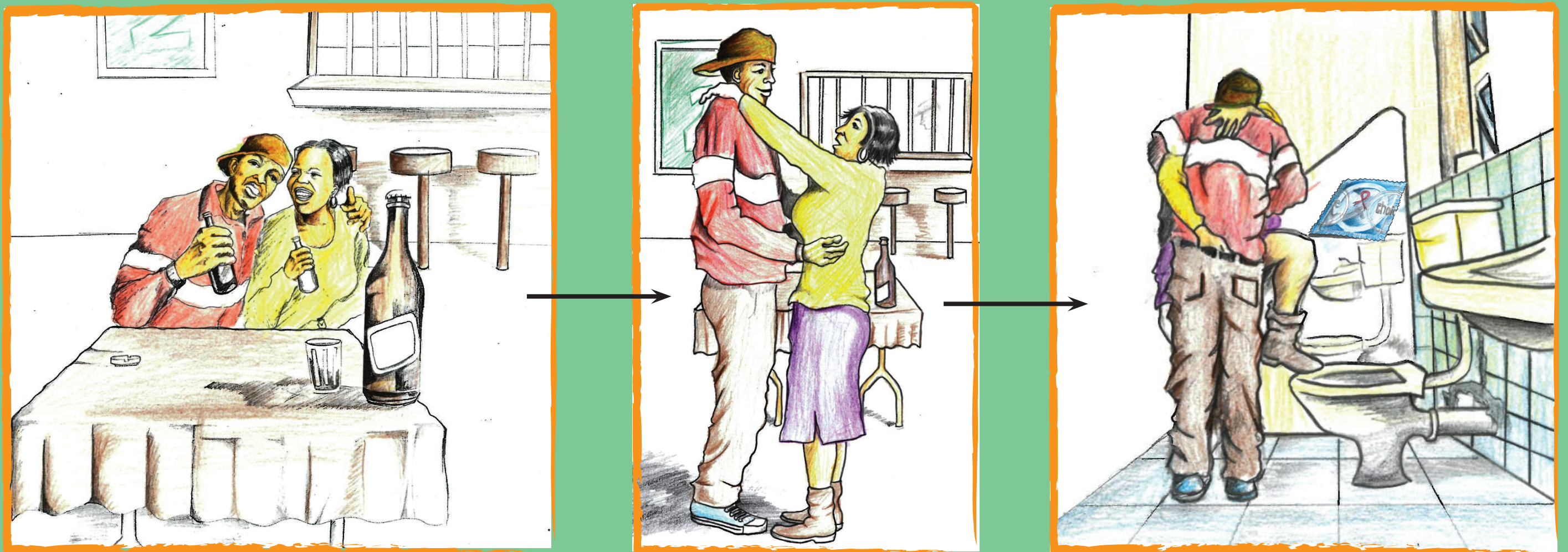
Right

You have the right to choose to drink or not to drink alcohol, and whether or not to have sex.

Responsibility

Plan ahead, always carry a condom. Make sure that the condom is on before you have sex. You should know your limit and drink responsibly.

Intergenerational Sex

Discuss the risks involved when a young person is persuaded to have sex with an older person in exchange

Reason

An older man feels younger and more powerful when he is with a young girl.

A young girl may think that an older man

Risk

You are more likely to get HIV and pass it on to others. You risk getting STIs and getting pregnant.

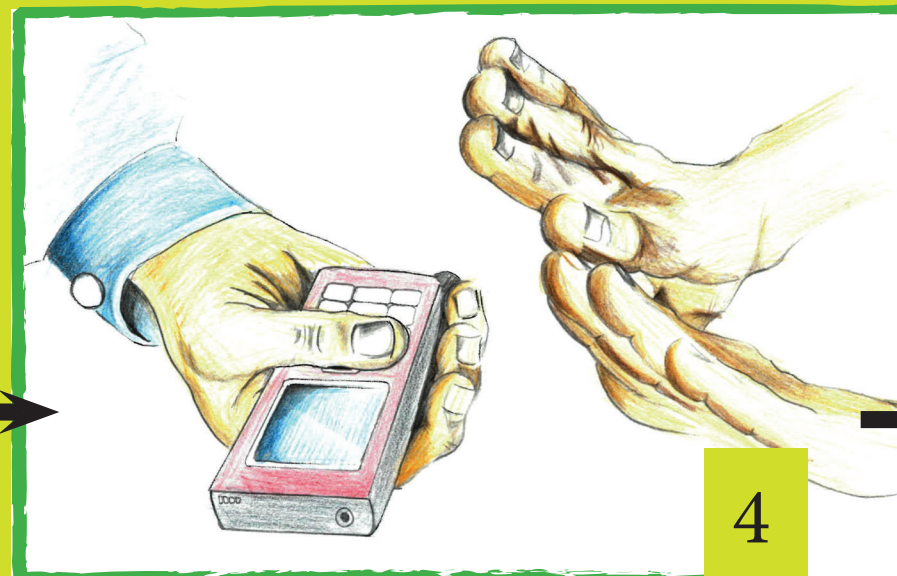
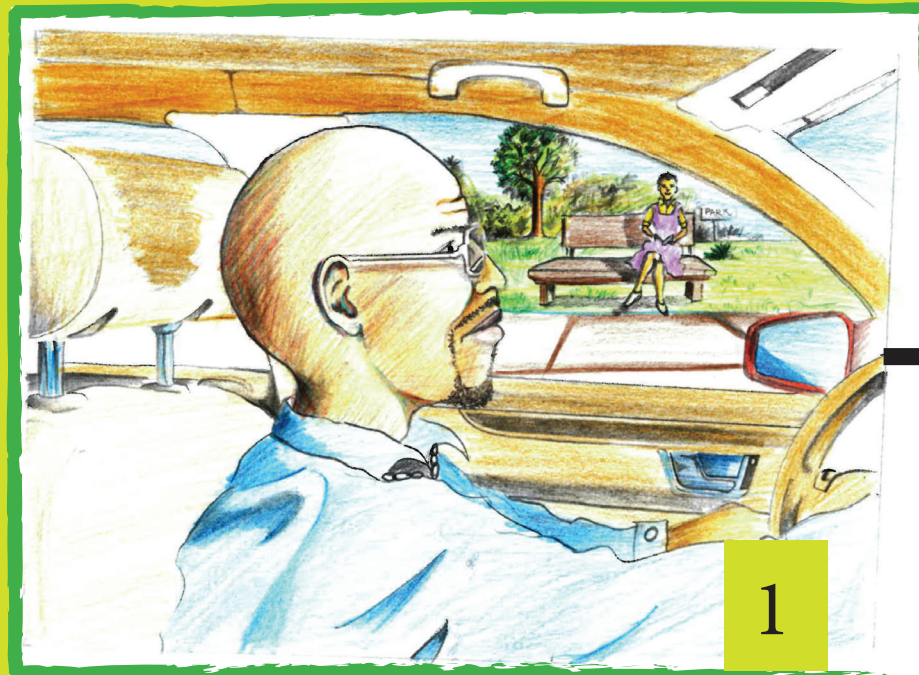
Right

You have the right to wear a condom to protect yourself. You have the right to say NO if you don't want to have sex. Sex with someone who is 16 years or younger is illegal.

Responsibility

You are responsible to respect the law and not bring shame to yourself and your community. Having sex with someone young enough to be your child, or old enough to be your father

Sexual Network

Discuss how HIV spreads easily in a sexual network

Reason

Many partners can be exciting.

Risk

You are more likely to get HIV and pass HIV on to others. You also risk getting STIs and getting pregnant.

Right

You have the right to know your own and your partners' HIV status. You have the right to protect yourself.

Responsibility

To know your HIV status and to always use a condom with ALL of your sexual partners (including your wife, husband, main partner and other lovers).
